Try swaying away from the traditional advent calendar with chocolate, and create your own! Be creative, we've seen things from a favorite family treat in numbered bags hung up, to a favorite mini bottle of liqueur or bottle of beer! The sky is the limit!

Santa's Board Games

Try thinking outside the board game box for this one. Cranberry Tea Lights

Let It Snow Create some unbelievably simple snowball garland with just some 1" Styrofoam balls, and some thread (clear is preferable). You can make the garland how short or long you need it, but just be sure to double to thread. Just use a needle to poke through the Styrofoam balls, and space them about 6" apart. You now have some beautiful snowball garland just like that!

Sparkling Wine For a super simple decor idea, try filling a wine bottle with some LED battery powered Christmas lights! Make sure you periodically check the bottle and make sure the temperature doesn't get too hot. This is why it's a good idea to use LED lights. This would look great in the window or in your kitchen.

Salami Chips

For a unique and very easy recipe you can bring to all of your Christmas parties, try making some salami chips! The only ingredient you need... is salami! (This is one of Rick's favorite recipes)

Ingredients

- 30 slices of your favorite salami, peppered and regular both work great
- 1. Preheat oven to 350°F.
- 2. Line a large baking sheet with parchment paper and arrange salami in single layer.3. Bake for 12 minutes, until the salami is crispy and chip-like. Make sure you check after 10



- Carefully transfer to paper towel and blot to remove any excess fat. Let cool.
- 5. Enjoy! Make it your own! Try it drizzled with olive oil, with cheese, dipping sauces or on a sandwich or burger!
